


Here is a step-by-step guide on how to use it during class time.

1. Visit chess.com/analysis




NOTE: An FEN is a series of letters and numbers that tell a chess software engine where to place each piece on the chess board.




4. Copy the FEN from the Chat area of GoTo Meeting
If you aren't in a meeting at present, use this sample:
4k3/pppppppp/8/8/8/8/PPPPPPPP/4K3 w - - 0 1




How to use Chess.com/Analysis

The sample FEN from above creates the position pictured below. You are almost there!




7. Click the "vs" button inside the laptop icon.
